HOG TROUGH

Why wait until after the turkey has been eaten to have your pumpkin fix. Try these sweet delights, from Ree Drummond of the Food Network. Have them with your morning coffee, but not Pumpkin Spice Latte.

Pumpkin Cinnamon Rolls

DOUGH

1 ½ C	Whole Milk
½ C	Vegetable Oil
½ C	Granulated Sugar
2 ¼ t	Active Dry Yeast (1 Package)
1 C	Pumpkin Puree
4 ½ C	All Purpose Flour
½ t	Ground Cinnamon
¼ t	Ground Ginger
¼ t	Ground Nutmeg
½ t	Baking Powder (Heaping)
½ t	Baking Soda
½ t	Salt
	Melted Butter, for Buttering the Baking Pans

FILLING

½ C	Butter, Melted (1 Stick)
½ C	Brown Sugar
½ C	Granulated Sugar
½ t	Cinnamon
½ t	Ground Ginger
¼ t	Ground Nutmeg
1 C	Pecans, Finely Chopped

FROSTING

8 oz.	Cream Cheese, Softened
1 ¾ - 2 C	Powdered Sugar
¼ C	Whole Milk, Plus More, If Needed
2 T	Butter, Melted

For the Dough: In a large saucepan, combine the milk, vegetable oil and granulated sugar. Heat until hot but not boiling, then remove the pan from the heat and allow to cool until the mixture is warm to the touch but not too hot. Sprinkle the yeast into the mixture and allow it to sit for 5 minutes. Stir in the pumpkin puree until combined.

Combine 4 cups of flour with the cinnamon, ginger and nutmeg. Sprinkle it into the mixture and stir until it just comes together. Cover the saucepan with a dish towel and set in a warm, draft free place for 1 hour.



HOG TROUGH (Cont.)

After 1 hour, the mixture should be very puffy and at least doubled in size. Stir in the baking powder, baking soda, salt and the remaining ½ cup of flour until total combined.

Preheat the oven to 375°. Drizzle butter into three pie pans, or a larger baking dish, and make sure the bottom is completely covered.

Turn out the dough onto a floured surface and press it into a rectangular shape. If it is too sticky, then sprinkle generously with additional flour until it is easy to handle. Flour a rolling pin and roll the dough into a large rectangle about 18 inches by 24 inches.

For the Filling: Drizzle the melted butter over the rolled-out dough and make sure the entire surface is covered. Mix together the brown sugar, granulated sugar, cinnamon, ginger and nutmeg in a medium bowl. Sprinkle this mixture over the surface of the dough, making sure all of the buttered surface is covered. Sprinkle with ½ to ¾ cup of the chopped pecans.

Starting at the top of the dough, roll it towards you into a large log, moving back and forth down the line of the dough in a “typewriter” motion, always rolling towards you. Roll it tightly as you go so the rolls will be nice and neat. When it’s all rolled, pinch the seam closed and turn the roll over seam side down. Slice into ½ to ¾ inch slices and place these on the buttered pans. Allow to rise for 20 minutes.

Bake the until the rolls are golden brown around the edges, 15 to 18 minutes.

For the Frosting: While the rolls are baking combine the cream cheese, powdered sugar, milk, butter and salt in a medium size mixing bowl. Beat until fluffy, adding more milk if necessary.

Frost the rolls as soon as they come out of the oven. Sprinkle the rolls with the extra pecans and allow to sit for 15 minutes before serving.
